Seminar on Updates to Fire Code 2018 Amendments Batch 5 to 8


ONLINE SEMINAR

On 18th June 2021, IFE conducted a seminar on the most recent updates (Batch 5 to 8) to the Code of Practice for Fire Precautions in Buildings 2018. The seminar was attended by 58 participants from IFE.

Batch 5 and 6 was presented by Er Yee Poh Kin, covering the topics on regulated fire safety products and materials. Due to the recent incidents with ACP fires globally, SCDF has taken initiative to detail the role and responsibilities of the various parties involved in the supply chain for fire safety products used in Singapore.


Batch 7 and 8 was presented Yeow Mei Leng, which included documentation requirements in the Fire Safety Report, fire protection systems (hydrant) requirements, standby and redundancy requirements for emergency ventilation systems. She also went through the requirements for the newer and special building/usage types introduced in the code such as capsule hotels and farm buildings.

The seminar ended with a brief but lively Q&A session chaired by Mr Tong Hong Haey from IFE.

Seminar on Fire Protection for Lithium - Ion Battery Energy Storage System

6 May 2021, 10:30am to 12pm

ONLINE SEMINAR


On 6th May 2021, Mr. Ashwit Dias from Siemens conducted a seminar on the fire risks associated with lithium-ion battery energy storage system within a building and described how appropriate fire protection systems can be adopted to mitigate these fire risks. The seminar was attended by 48 participants from IFE and its affiliated partners.

The increasing wide-spread use of lithium-ion batteries introduces 'new' fire risks from electrical fire risk, heavy power load resulting in short-circuiting or overheating, high air ventilation increasing risk of fire spread, and thermal runaway of the battery cells.

Mr. Dias also went through explanation of the process of thermal runaway and fire tests done to study this phenomenon.

As part of the seminar, he also went through the different technologies developed by Siemens to address thermal runaway in terms of detection, shutdown and propagation prevention.

The seminar ended with a brief but lively Q&A session chaired by Mr Tong Hong Haey from IFE.

The session will highlight one case study in relation to fire investigation. The aim is to generate and encourage thoughts and some inputs by the audience. In doing so, it is envisaged that the audience will gain insights into not only the physical forensics but also of the liabilities.

Speaker Profile

David Townsend is an experienced fire and explosion investigator. He has, this year, reached 45 unbroken years in fire which began with a full 30-year career in the London Fire Brigade. Now, as manager of Andrew Moore & Associates group fire response and investigation services, he is responsible for fire, and explosion investigations as well as fire related consultancy assignments, ashore and afloat, worldwide.

From fire fighter to fire commander, David has attended over 3,000 substantial fires. To date he has investigated over 2,200 fires, including all building types and classes, yachts, ships, industrial plants and vehicles.

He has court experience as an Expert witness in the UK and abroad, including Coroners inquests, Criminal and Civil courts. He was a Fire Investigation trainer for the National Fire Service College, UK from 2007 to 2009 and, on behalf of the college, trained the Kuwait Fire Service fire investigation team.
